Anglo American has been working with our neighbours for many years to minimise future mining impacts. Since 2009 we have made no less than 10 changes to the Drayton South mine as a result of stakeholder feedback.

We have moved the future Drayton South mining activities back behind the ridgeline and designed a visual bund (landscaped hill) that will shield Drayton South's mining operations.

Anglo American also made the decision to forgo 53 million tonnes or \$5 billion worth of coal reserves through the reduction of mining areas to maintain a buffer from our neighbours and prevent views to mining areas.

These changes to our mine plan have been the result of more than 25 meetings with the neighbouring horse studs over four years.

It is important to remember that while we have agreed to multiple changes to the Drayton South project, mining has been considered for this location for more than

seven decades, with exploration and drilling beginning in the 1940s. The current exploration license was issued in 1998.

Anglo American will also:

- Spend \$125 million on dust suppression technologies;
- Progressively introduce truck models that will reduce dust;
- Surface treat all permanent haul roads with dust suppressant;
- Complete aerial seeding for rehabilitation areas; and
- Use noise suppression technology on mobile equipment.
