

GROSVENOR

Grosvenor is a \$1.95 billion greenfield underground metallurgical coal project on track towards first longwall coal production in late 2016.

LOCATION

- Northern part of the Bowen Basin in Central Queensland. Adjacent to Anglo American's Moranbah North mine.

HISTORY AND CONSTRUCTION

- Construction began in 2012;
- Underground works commenced in 2013 with the launch of the tunnel boring machine (TBM) to construct two underground tunnels, a first in Queensland mining;
- The TBM constructed the conveyor tunnel in 2014 and the people and equipment tunnel was completed in February 2015;



- More than 1000 new jobs created in construction and operation.

COAL PRODUCTION AND RESOURCES

- First coal production achieved in 2014 and longwall mining to begin in late-2016;
- Coal processing through the Moranbah North Coal Handling and Preparation Plant;
- Expected to produce 5 million tonnes per annum (Mtpa) of high quality coking coal for export;
- At December 2014, estimates for Run of Mine (Rom) reserves are approximately 193 Mt of metallurgical coal, with an additional 190 Mt of in-situ coal resources outside the current mine layout.

OWNERSHIP AND OPERATION

- 100% Anglo American;
- Managed and operated by Anglo American.
