Each year, Anglo American contributes funding to support sustainable development initiatives that make a lasting, positive contribution to the communities where we operate.

What you need to know

Each year, Anglo American contributes funding to support sustainable development initiatives within our local areas of operation in Central Queensland.

Requests for funding support are assessed against criteria to ensure selected initiatives deliver value, foster community development and growth, and fundamentally meet the needs of the local people in the communities where we operate.

Our Community Grant Program opens 1 March 2026 and remains open until 31 March 2026.

Eligibility and criteria

Eligibility

To receive funding, organisations must (1) have an ABN; (2) be a community organisation, not-for-profit group, or government agency, and; (3) provide services or manage sustainable community initiatives which contribute to the well-being and development of our local communities.

Organisations must also be based, or operate within the footprint of, one of our areas of operation, which include Moranbah, Middlemount, Moura, Banana and Theodore.

All requested documentation must be submitted for consideration, including a completed risk assessment. A template is provided in the application form.

Key priority areas

Successful projects will align with one or more of Anglo American's key priority areas, which are determined during our five-yearly Social Performance Planning process. This process assesses the needs of our local communities through research and community feedback and identifies meaningful ways we can sustainably work together to address those needs.

The key priority areas identified by our Social Performance Planning process are:

- Education
- Engagement
- Environment
- Health and well-being
- Livelihoods

1. What supporting documents do I need to include in my application?

- You will need to have the following:
 - A valid Certificate of Currency for your organisation's insurance policy
 - A valid quote for your project/event that validates the expenditure requested
 - A copy of the previous year's audited financial records, as a minimum
 - A completed risk assessment
 - Any additional documentation you select from the list provided in the application

2. Why I do I need to complete a Risk Assessment?

- As part of Anglo American's due diligence process, a risk assessment provides validation your organisation has thought about and assessed the risks involved when undertaking a project or event using Anglo American funding. The Risk Assessment template can be found within the JotForm application (or you can provide your own). We highly recommend you download and save the template provided before completion and save the template again before uploading it onto the online portal.

3. How do I know whether my organisation is registered for GST?

- You can confirm whether your organisation is registered for GST by entering your ABN into ABN Lookup in Google.

4. How long will it take until I know whether my application has been successful?

- Please allow up to two months for the Anglo American Community Grants Program approval process to fulfil due diligence requirements. We highly recommend that you put in an application now if your project/event is to take place prior to June next year.

5. Why is it necessary to complete a Final Project Report?

- A Final Project Report is in effect the acquittal for funds received and explains where the money you had applied for has been spent. It is important that you submit a Final Project Report prior to submitting a new community grant application the following year.

6. Can I submit my application past 31 March 2026?

- Unfortunately, no applications will be accepted beyond the deadline being 31 March 2026.

7. How can I be sure whether my project is suitable for the Community Grants Program?

- If you are unsure about whether your project or event meets the key priority areas or falls within one of the permitted categories, please contact your local Social Performance Specialist to discuss this before submitting your application (refer to above contact details).

8. Am I required to take photos of the project or event that I have received funding for?

- The submission of photos will keep us informed in terms of the fruition of your event/project and would provide us with the opportunity to publish it on our social platform. Please let us know if you would like us to participate in any photos or promotional opportunities by contacting the Social Performance Specialist within your region.
